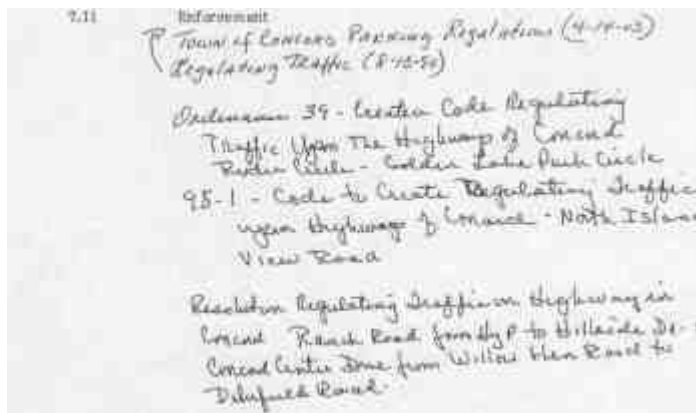

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7.340.01 to 7.941.03 STATE TRAFFIC LAWS ADOPTED. The statutory provisions following the prefix "7" describing and defining regulations with respect to vehicles and traffic in the following enumerated section of the Wisconsin Statutes, exclusive of any provisions therein relating to the penalties to be imposed or the punishment for violation of such statutes, are hereby adopted and by reference made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth herein. Any act required to be performed or prohibited by any statute incorporated herein by reference is required or prohibited by this chapter.

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7.02 SPEED RESTRICTIONS. (1) STATE LIMITS ADOPTED. The provisions of Sees. 346.57, 346.58, 346.59, and 346.595, Wis. Stats., relating to speed restrictions of vehicles are hereby adopted as part of this provision.

(2) SPEED LIMITS SET. The speed limits are increased or modified as hereinafter set forth pursuant to Sec. 349.11, Wis. Stats., as follows:

(a) 15 Miles Per Hour.

1. When passing a schoolhouse at those times when children are going to or from school or are playing within the sidewalk area at or about school.
2. Concord Center Drive between Country View Lane to Grey Fox Trail, at those times when children are going to or from school or are playing within the area near the school and near Concord Center Drive.

(b) 35 Miles Per Hour.

1. Hillside Drive .25 miles north of and .25 miles south of Church Drive.
2. Country View Lane.
3. Concord Center Drive from S.T.H. 135 East one mile.
4. Golden Lake Park Road from Highway 18 North to 200 feet North of Ruders Circle.
5. All of Golden Lake Park Circle.
6. All of Ruders Circle.

(c) 45 miles Per Hour.

1. S.T.H. 135 from 194 overpass to Hickory Hill Drive.

7.03 PARKING RESTRICTION, STOP SIGNS, YIELD SIGNS. (1) No person shall park a vehicle for longer than 2 hours between the hours of 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. on any street, road or highway in the Town.

(2) **PARKING PROHIBITED IN CERTAIN SPECIFIED PLACES.** No person shall stop or leave any vehicle standing in any of the following places except temporarily for the purpose of loading or unloading passengers while the vehicle is attended by a licensed operator so that it may promptly be moved in case of an emergency or to avoid obstruction of traffic:

- (a) In a loading zone.
- (b) In an alley in a business district.
- (c) Within 4' of the entrance to an alley or a private road or driveway.
- (d) Upon any portion of a highway where and at the time when parking is prohibited, limited or restricted by official traffic signs.

(3) **STOPPING PROHIBITED IN CERTAIN PLACES.** No person shall stop or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended and whether temporarily or otherwise, in any of the following places:

- (a) Within an intersection.
- (b) On a crosswalk.
- (c) On a sidewalk or sidewalk area, except when parking in such places clearly indicated by official traffic signs, markers or parking meters.
- (d) On the roadway side of any parked vehicle unless double parking is clearly indicated by official traffic signs or markers.
- (e) On the left side of the street or highway.

(4) **PARKING ON STREETS.** A vehicle must be parked parallel to the edge of the street headed in the direction of traffic on the right side of the street.

(5) **ALL NIGHT PARKING PROHIBITED.** No person shall park any vehicle for longer than 2 hours between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. on any day, except physicians executing emergency calls.

7.04 SNOWMOBILES. (1) STATE SNOWMOBILE LAWS ADOPTED. Except otherwise specifically provided in this chapter, the statutory provisions describing defining regulations with respect to snowmobiles in the following enumerated sections 3 Wisconsin Statutes are hereby adopted by reference and made part of this section fully set forth herein. Acts required to be performed or prohibited by such Laws are required or prohibited by this section.

(2) **APPLICABILITY OF RULES OF THE ROAD TO SNOWMOBILES.** The operator of a snowmobile upon a roadway shall, in addition to the provisions of Ch. 350, be subject to Sees. 346.04, 346.06, 346.11, 346.14(1), 346.18, 346.19, 346.20, 346.21, 346.26, 346.27, 346.33, 346.35, 346.37, 346.39, 346.40, 346.44, 346.46, 346.47, 346.48, 346.50(l)(b), 346.51, 346.52, 346.53, 346.54, 346.55, 346.87, 346.88, 346.89, 346.90, 346.91, 346.92(1), and 346.94(1), (6), (6m) and (9), Wis. Stats.

(3) **PERMITTING OPERATION BY IMPROPER PERSONS PROHIBITED.** No owner or person having charge or control of a snowmobile shall authorize or permit any person to operate such snowmobile who is not permitted under State law to operate such snowmobile or who is under the influence of an intoxicant or a dangerous or narcotic drug.

(4) **OPERATION WHILE UNDER INFLUENCE PROHIBITED.** Sec. 346.63, Wis., Stats., shall apply to the operation of a snowmobile anywhere within the Town.

(5) **WRITTEN CONSENT OF OWNER REQUIRED!** The consent required under Sees. 350.10(6), (11), (12), and (13), Wis. Stats., shall be written consent dated and limited to the year in which the consent is given. If the property is owned or leased by more than one person, the consent of each shall be obtained.

7.05 OFFICIAL TRAFFIC SIGNS AND SIGNALS. (1) Every operator of a vehicle approaching an official stop sign at an intersection shall cause such vehicle to stop before entering the intersection except when directed to proceed by a traffic officer.

(2) Stops shall be made in the following manner:

- (a) If there is no clearly marked stop line, the operator shall stop his vehicle before entering the crosswalk on the near side of the intersection.
- (b) If there is no crosswalk at the intersection or if the operator can efficiently observe traffic on the intersecting roadway from the stop line or crosswalk, he shall, before entering the intersection, stop his vehicle at such point as will enable him to efficiently observe the traffic on the intersecting roadway.

7.06 MISCELLANEOUS PROHIBITED ACTS. (1) **DRIVING ON SIDE WALK.** The operator of a vehicle shall not drive upon any sidewalk area except at a permanent or temporary established driveway unless permitted to do so by the local authorities.

(2) **RACINGS.** No operator of a motor vehicle shall participate in any race or speed or endurance contest upon any highway.

(3) **PLACING INJURIOUS SUBSTANCE ON HIGHWAY.** No person shall place or cause to be placed upon a highway any foreign substance which is or may be injurious to any vehicle or part thereof.

(4) **DEBRIS ON PUBLIC OR PRIVATE PROPERTY.** No person shall throw or deposit any type of debris or waste material on or along any highway or on any other public or private property.

(5) **PERMITTING THROWING OF DEBRIS ON HIGHWAY.** No operator or occupant of any vehicle shall throw or deposit any type of debris or waste materials upon the highway.

(6) **SPILLING LOADS OF WASTE OR FOREIGN MATTER.** The operator of every vehicle transporting waste or foreign matter on the highways of this state shall provide adequate facilities to prevent such waste or foreign matter from spilling on or along the highways.

(7) **DEFACEMENT OF PROPERTY.** No person shall tear up, injure, deface or destroy any public pavement, roadway, sidewalk, crosswalk, curbs and gutters, water main, sewer, bridge or culvert, nor dig any hole, ditch or drain in any street, alley or public ground without the permission of the Town Board.

(8) **VEHICLE NOISE.** No driver shall cause the tires of a motor vehicle to spin, emit unnecessary loud noises, unnecessarily throw stones or gravel, or cause such vehicle to make any loud noise that would tend to annoy others and disturb the public peace.

7.07 REGULATION OF BOATING ON GOLDEN LAKE. (1) **SLOW-NO-WAKE.** No person shall operate a motorboat at a speed greater than a slow-no-wake speed on Golden Lake on Saturdays, Sundays and all legal holidays between the hours of 12:00 Noon and 4:00 p.m.

(2) **DEFINITIONS:**

- (a) "Slow-No-Wake" means operation of a motorboat at the slowest possible speed necessary to maintain steerage.
- (b) "Motorboat" means any boat as defined in Sec. 30.50(2) Statutes.

(3) **PENALTY.** Except as otherwise provided, any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall forfeit not more than Fifty (\$50) Dollars for the first offense and shall forfeit not more than One Hundred (\$100) Dollars upon conviction of the same offense a second or subsequent time within one year.

7.08 AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING ATV AND UTV ROUTES AND REGULATING THE OPERATION OF ATVs AND UTVs ON SUCH ROUTES (passed July 8, 2019)

SECTION I - Intent

The Town of Concord adopts the following all-terrain vehicle route ordinance for the operation of ATVs and UTVs upon designated town roadways. Following due consideration of the recreational value to connect trail opportunities and weighed against the possible dangers, public health, liability aspects, terrain involved, traffic density and history of automobile traffic, these routes have been created.

SECTION II - State Laws Adopted

The statutory provision in Wis. Stat. § 23.33 and § 340 - 348 establishing definitions and regulations with respect to ATVs and UTVs, and Wis. Admin. Code, Chapter NR 64 are hereby adopted and by reference made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth herein. Unless otherwise provided in this chapter, any act required to be performed or prohibited by any statute incorporated herein is hereby required or prohibited by this ordinance. Any future amendments, revisions or modifications of the statutes incorporated herein are made a part of this chapter in order to secure uniform statewide regulation of ATVs and UTVs.

SECTION III - Definitions

- 1) **All-terrain vehicle (ATV)** [Wis. Stat. § **340.01(2g)**]. A commercially designed and manufactured motor-driven device that has a weight, without fluids, of 900 pounds or less, has a width of 50 inches or less, is equipped with a seat designed to be straddled by the operator, and travels on 3 or more low-pressure tires and non-pneumatic tires.
- 2) **Utility terrain vehicle (UTV)** means any of the following [Wis. Stat. § 23.33(1)(ng)]:
 - a) A commercially designed and manufactured motor driven device that does not meet federal motor vehicle safety standards in effect on July 1, 2012, that is not a golf cart, low-speed vehicle, dune buggy, mini-truck, or tracked vehicle, that is designed to be used primarily off of a highway, and that has, and was originally manufactured with, all the following:
 - i) A weight, without fluids, of 2,000 pounds or less.
 - ii) Four or more low-pressure tires or non-pneumatic tires.
 - iii) A cargo box installed by the manufacturer.
 - iv) A steering wheel.
 - v) A taillight.
 - vi) A brake light.
 - vii) Two headlights.

- viii) A width of not more than 65 inches.
 - ix) A system of seat belts, or similar system, for restraining each occupant of the device in the event of an accident.
 - x) A system of structural members designed to reduce the likelihood that an occupant would be crushed as a result of a rollover of the device.
- b) A commercially designed and manufactured motor driven device to which all the following applies:
- i) It has a weight, without fluids, of more than 900 pounds but not more than 2,000.
 - ii) It has a width of 50 inches or less.
 - iii) It is equipped with a seat designed to be straddled by the operator.
 - iv) It travels on 3 or more low-pressure tires or non-pneumatic tires.
- 3) **All ATV/ UTV vehicle route.** Means a highway or sidewalk designated for use by all-terrain vehicle operators by the governmental agency having jurisdiction as authorized under this section.
- 4) All other applicable words or phrases defined within Wis. Stat. § 23.33 and §340.01 are incorporated within this ordinance.

SECTION IV - Routes

No person shall operate an off-road vehicle on any Town Road, alley, park, parking lot, any public lands or parking lots held open to the public, or on any land zoned residential within the Town except as provided below.

- 1) Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 23.33(11), the following Town Roads are designated as all-terrain and utility terrain vehicle routes:
- All official town roads located within the Town of Concord, but only if the road is signed in accordance with Wis. Stat. § 23.33(8). At the time of adoption of this ordinance there are no roads that are signed.
- 2) Routes must be signed in accordance with NR 64.12(7). GLIDE FOUR SEASONS CLUB will be responsible for all costs of all ATV/UTV signs on town roads and for all costs of their proper installation and future maintenance. No town roads shall be signed unless GLIDE FOUR SEASONS CLUB first obtains the written approval of the Town of Concord Town Board.
- 3) All signed routes must include ATV/UTV speed limits.
- 4) The Town of Concord reserves the right to close or modify routes at any time.

SECTION V - Conditions of Route Use

The following conditions shall apply to all operators and passengers on ATV/UTV routes in the Town of Concord.

- 1) All ATV/UTV units shall be registered for public use and display the required decals and registration plates in accordance with Wis. Stat. § **23.33(2)(c)2.**
- 2) All ATV/UTV operators shall observe all applicable rules of the road governing motorized vehicles on municipal streets in accordance with Wis. Stat. Chapter 346 and Wis. Stat. § 23.33.
- 3) ATV/UTVs may be operated only on the extreme right side of the roadway except that left turns may be made from any part of the roadway which is safe given prevailing conditions. (Wis. Stat. § **23.22(4)(d)4.**)
- 4) ATV/UTV routes shall have a maximum speed limit of 35mph unless posted otherwise.
- 5) All ATV/UTV operators shall slow the vehicle to a safe speed when operating within 100 feet of a pedestrian or horse.

- 6) No ATV/UTV may be operated on any designated route without fully functional headlights, taillights and brake lights. Operators must display a lighted headlight and taillight at all times while on the trail or route.
- 7) All ATV/UTV operators and passengers under the age of 18 are required to wear a minimum DOT standard ATV or motorcycle helmet in accordance with Wis. Stat. § 23.33(3g).
- 8) All ATV/UTV operators shall ride single file.
- 9) ATV/UTVs may be operated on paved roadway surfaces only.
- 10) No ATV/UTV may be operated on any designated route between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. daily. (Wis. Stat. § 23.33(8)(d))
- 11) ATV/UTVs that do not meet Wisconsin State or local noise pollution requirements may not be operated on any route.
- 12) Operation within any municipal park unless specifically designated is prohibited.
- 13) No person shall leave or allow any ATV owned or operated by him/herself to remain unattended on any public highway or public property while the motor is running or with the starting key left in the ignition.
- 14) Liability insurance which meets the minimum mandatory automobile liability insurance requirements in Wisconsin is required for all ATVs/UTVs operated on ATV/UTV routes within the Town of Concord.
- 15) A Valid Department of Transportation driver's license is required to operate any ATV/UTV on a designated route within the town.

SECTION VI In accordance with Wis. Stat. § 23.33 (11)(am)(3), the operation of ATVs and UTVs is permitted on a highway bridge that is not part of the national system of interstate and defense highways, that is 1,000 feet in length or less, and is located within the territorial boundaries of the Town of Concord, regardless of whether the Town of Concord has jurisdiction over the highway, provided that a person crossing a bridge shall do all the following:

- 1) Cross the bridge in the most direct manner practicable and at a place where no obstruction prevents a quick and safe crossing;
- 2) stay as far to the right of the roadway or shoulder as practicable;
- 3) Stop the vehicle prior to the crossing,
- 4) Yield the right-of-way to other vehicles, pedestrians, and electric personal assistive mobility devices using the roadway or shoulder;
- 5) Exit the highway as quickly and safely as practicable after crossing the bridge.

SECTION VII - Penalties

Wisconsin state All-Terrain Vehicle penalties as found in Wis. Stat. § 23.33(13) are adopted by reference.

SECTION VIII – Right to Repeal

The Concord Town Board reserves the right to repeal this ordinance and prevent all use of ATVs/ UTVs on Town of Concord roads at any time with or without cause.

SECTION IX - Effective Date

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force after its passage and publication in a manner provided for by law.

7.10 PENALTIES. Any person violating any provision of this chapter may be punished by forfeiting not less than \$2 nor more than \$1,000 together with the costs of prosecution and in default of payment of the forfeiture and cost of prosecution may be imprisoned in the County Jail until said forfeiture and costs are paid, but not to exceed 90 days. In no case shall the forfeiture for a violation of any provision of this chapter exceed the maximum allowable forfeiture provided for the same offense by statute.

7.11 ENFORCEMENT. (1) ENFORCEMENT PROCEDURE. This chapter shall be enforced according to Sec. 66.12 and Sees. 345.20 to 345.53, Wis. Stats.

(2) DEPOSIT, (a) Any person arrested for a violation of this chapter may make a deposit of money as directed by the arresting officer at the office of the Clerk of Courts or by mailing the deposit to the Clerk of Courts. The arresting officer or the person receiving the deposit shall comply with Sec. 343.27, Wis. Stats., or, if the deposit is mailed, the signed statement required under Sec. 343.27 shall be mailed with the deposit. The arresting officer or the person receiving the deposit shall notify the arrested person, orally or in writing, that:

1. If he fails to appear in court at the time fixed in the citation, he will be deemed to have tendered a plea of no contest and submitted to a forfeiture plus costs not to exceed the amount of the deposit; or
 2. If he fails to appear in court at the time fixed in the citation, and if the court does not accept the deposit as a forfeiture, he will be summoned into court to answer the complaint.
- (b) The amount of the deposit shall be determined in accordance with the deposit schedule established by the Wisconsin Judicial Conference and shall include the penalty assessment established under Sec. 165.87, Wis. Stats., and costs. If a deposit schedule has not been established, the arresting officer shall require the alleged offender to deposit the forfeiture established by the Chief of Police, which shall include the 12% penalty assessment established under Sec. 165.87, Wis. Stats. Deposits for non- moving violations shall not include the penalty assessment.
- (c) The arresting officer or the person receiving the deposit shall issue the arrested person a receipt therefor as required by Sec. 345.26(3)(b), Wis. Stats.

(3) STIPULATION OF NO CONTEST. Any person charged with a violation of this Chapter except Sees. 7.346.62(1) and 7.346.63(1) may make a stipulation of no contest pursuant to Sec. 345.27, Wis. Stats., which shall be received at the office of the Clerk of Courts within 10 days of the date of the alleged violation. Such person shall, at the time of entering into the stipulation, make the deposit required under sub. (2) if he has not already done so. A person who has mailed or filed a stipulation under this subsection may, however, appear in court on the appearance date and may be relieved from the stipulation for cause shown as required in Sec. 345.37, Wis. Stats.

A RESOLUTION TO CREATE A CODE REGULATING TRAFFIC UPON THE HIGHWAYS OF THE TOWN OF CONCORD JEFFERSON, WISCONSIN

The Town of Concord hereby determines that the statutory speed limits on the following highways or portions thereof are unreasonable, unsafe, or imprudent and modifies such speed limits as follows:

The speed limit will be reduced from 55 miles per hour to 45 miles per hour on Concord Center Drive at the end, of the 25 miles per hour section heading east: until Willow Glen Road at the four corners.

The speed limit will be reduced from 55 miles per hour to 45 miles per hour from the four corners. Concord Center Drive west to Hwy F.

TOWN OF CONCORD PARKING REGULATIONS

(1) PARKING PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES. Except temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading or in receiving or discharging passengers or property and while the vehicle is attended by a licensed operator so that it may be moved promptly in case of an emergency or to avoid obstruction of traffic, no person shall at any time park or leave standing any vehicle, upon any of the following highways or parts of highways:

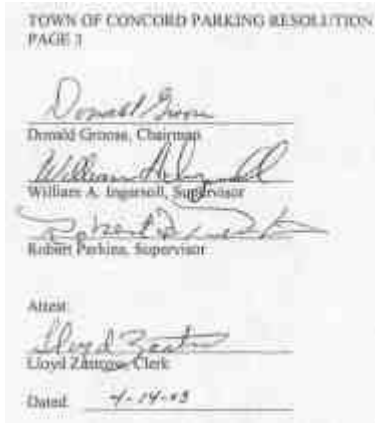

(2) REMOVAL OF ILLEGALLY PARKED VEHICLES Any vehicle parked or left standing upon a highway, street or alley or other public grounds in violation of any of the provisions of this Section of this code is declared to be a hazard to traffic and public safety Such vehicle shall be removed by the operator, upon request of any police officer, to a position where parking, stopping or standing is not prohibited Any police officer after issuing a citation for illegal parking, stopping or standing of any unattended vehicle in violation of this code is authorized to remove such vehicle to a position where parking is not prohibited The officer may order a motor carrier holding a permit to perform vehicle towing services, a licensed motor vehicle salvage dealer or a licensed motor vehicle dealer who performs vehicle towing services to remove and store such vehicle in any storage garage or rental parking grounds or any facility of the person providing the towing services The owner or operator of a vehicle so removed shall pay the cost of towing and storage

(3) REGISTRATION RECORD OF VEHICLE AS EVIDENCE When any vehicle is found upon a street or highway in violation of any provision of this code regulating the stopping, standing or parking of vehicles and the identity of the operator cannot be determined, the owner as shown by the ownership registration of the vehicle supplies by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, or a comparable authority of any other State, shall be subject to appropriate penalty

(4) As per Statute 86.191, Section 5, Any person who violates any of the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$25 00 nor more than \$100 00 for each offense or by imprisonment in the county jail for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

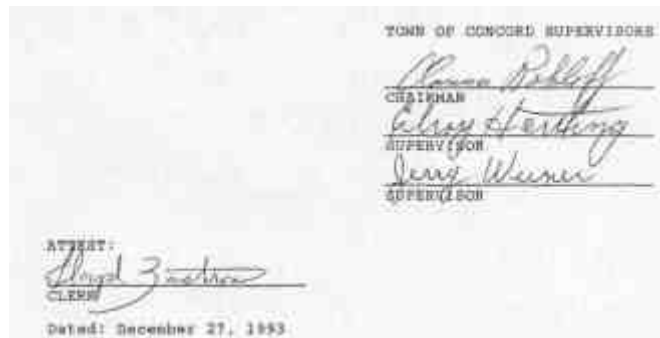
